We are currently exploring opportunities to offer a summer school experience for FIT Academy students the weeks of July 27 and August 3rd. This summer school program would be compliant with MDH and MDE requirements and may include a portion of the program at school. Look for more information soon!

Learning Plan for Next Fall

We know many of you are wondering what school will look like in the Fall. While there is still a great deal of unknown, we are positioning ourselves to offer the most flexible options to meet our families' needs. To that end, we are planning for both high quality on-site and distance learning experiences for our students and families.

Much is still in discussion at the state level but our sense is that we will be allowed to offer both on-site and distance learning in the Fall. If so, we plan to offer families choices that best meets their individual needs. These choices might include a traditional schedule where students attend each day, a distance learning option where students are working from home, and a blended/hybrid schedule, meaning students attend

school some of the time and do distance learning some of the time. When you look at it, these two options are combinations of two settings we already know very well; Traditional on-site instruction and distance learning.

These plans are still very much in the early stages but we thought it would be important to inform our families of our intentions as you plan for next Fall.
