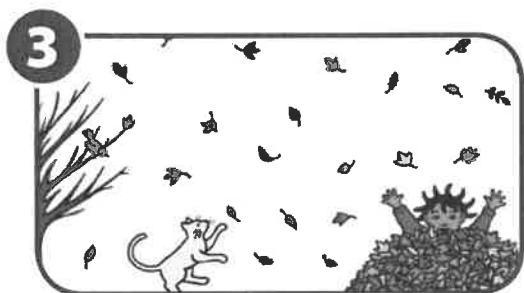
What Makes the Seasons?



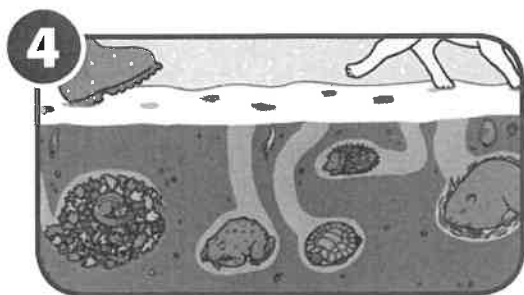
Spring melts the snow. It brings rain and leaves begin to bud. Seeds sprout and grow. But spring cannot stay. It leaves on a summer day.

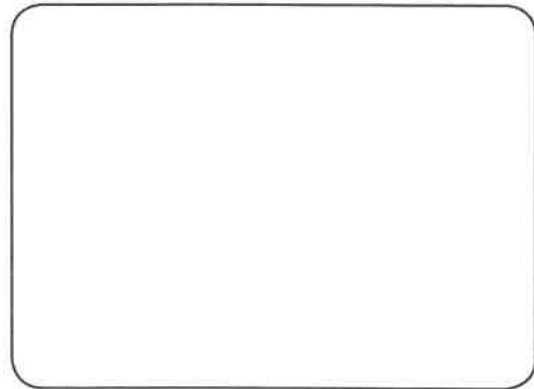

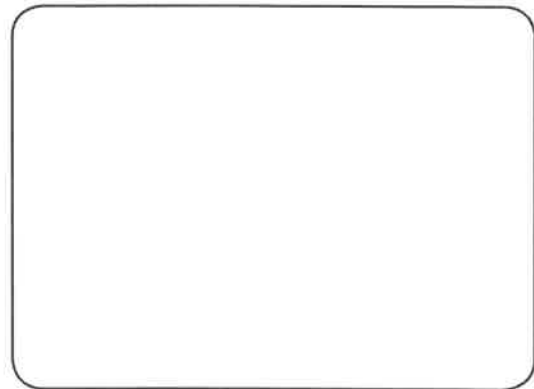
